Cayman Prep and High School Students top the world in the Cambridge International AS Level Marine Science Examinations!

Two AS Level Marine Science students of Cayman Prep and High School have been awarded a special certificate stating that they gained the highest mark in the world in the Cambridge International AS Level Marine Science in June 2010!! These two students are Cody Panton, who took it as an additional subject in Y13, and Kalyn Teeling. Mrs. Sheila Purdom, Principal of the High School Division, commented that, "This is an outstanding achievement for the School to have not one, but two of our students scoring higher marks than anyone else in the world. In fact, our results overall far surpassed cumulative world totals. We entered 14 candidates in total, 3 from Y13 and the rest from Y12. Three of our students gained Grade "A" results: Cody, Kalyn and Alex Fraser. Our pass rates at all levels significantly surpassed the cumulative world totals as set out in the table below.
