Five Levels of Leadership

If a leader doesn't have influence, then he or she is ineffective. In the military, leaders can use rank to exercise authority. In business, bosses have tremendous leverage in the form of salary, benefits, and perks, as most followers are cooperative when their livelihood is at stake. But in voluntary organizations, such as churches, the only thing that works is leadership in its purest form. Leaders there, have only their influence to aid them. Followers in voluntary organizations cannot be forced to get on board. If the leader has no influence with them. then they won't follow.

We can increase our influence and leadership potential if we understand the following levels of leadership:

POSITION - This is the basic entry level of leadership. The only influence you have is that which comes with a title. However, real leadership is more than having authority; it is more than having the technical training, and following the proper procedures. Real leadership is being the person others will gladly follow. A real leader knows the difference between being the boss and being a leader.

PERMISSION – On this level, people follow you because they want to. People don't care how much you know until they know how much you care. Leadership begins with the heart, not the head. It flourishes with a meaningful relationship, not more regulations. The agenda is People Development. On this level, the leader donates time, energy, and focus on the follower's needs and desires. People who are unable to build solid, lasting relationships will soon discover that they are unable to sustain long, effective leadership.

PRODUCTION – On this level, people follow because of what you have done for turnover is low, needs are being met, goals are realized; and accom-

panying the growth is Momentum. Leading and influencing others becomes fun, problems are solved with minimum effort, fresh statistics are shared on a regular basis with the people who undergird the growth of the organization, and team members are results-oriented.

PEOPLE DEVELOPMENT – On this level, people follow because of what you have done for them. A leader is effective, not because of his or her power, but because of his or her ability to empower others. Loyalty to the leader reaches its highest peak when the follower has personally grown through the mentorship of the leader. You win people's hearts by helping them grow personally.

PERSONHOOD - On this level, people follow because of who you are and what you represent. The leader would have spent time mentoring and moulding leaders, and the followers are loyal and sacrificial because of the standards of the leader.

For your leadership to remain effective, it is essential that you take the other influencers on your team with you to the higher levels. You must know what level you are on at this moment. You also need to know which people are on which level. When either the leader or the follower is unwilling to make the sacrifices a new level demands, influence will begin to decrease. Notice the progression from Level Two through Level Four. The focus goes from liking you to liking what you do for the common interest of all concerned. Each level climbed by the leader and the followers adds another reason why people want to follow. However, each level stands upon the previous one and will crumble if the lower level is neglected.
