"MISSION POSSIBLE" - Camp Ministry Reaches Out

Youth across the Cayman Islands joined for a week of excitement, activities, spiritual guidance, and mission consciousness. "Mission Possible" was the theme for the 2018 Summer Camps facilitated by the United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands. The church coordinated two camps from July 7 - 19. The first week for teenagers ages 13 - 17 and the second week for children ages 8 - 12. The camp revolved around the theme and act of mission! Children were guided and challenged to Follow the Leader (Jesus Christ), Stick to God's plan for their lives, Select God in every situation, Know the mission God has for them, and remember that God's mission never ends!

Not only did the youth reflect on mission, but they were taught that mission is about action; going out and making a difference in the community. Campers were visited by two young people in the Cayman Islands who are actively involved in local mission/experiences. They were visited by Bradley McLaughlin, who shared how his mission in life was transformed by his passion for cooking, he now works closely with the Youth Services unit and inspires many of the youth in Cayman. "Hannah's Heroes" and "Meals on Wheels" were mission experiences that challenged the campers to be involved in community needs. A young participant in the Big Shave event hosted by the St. Baldrick's Foundation, Kylie Freeland, came and shared about her experience and the efforts her and her grandfather (Herbert Crawford) made to raise over \$5,000!!

The Meals on Wheels experience was eye-opening for many campers, who never realized the impact the organization has on the communities it feeds. The campers were guided by Ms. Hope and her Meals on Wheels team in the Bodden Town community and delivered meals from Lower Valley to Pease Bay. Campers were able to speak with some of the community members as they received their meals and at times were given the chance to pray with them.

Mission Possible! Not only a theme for the United Church's camp ministry this year but a mindset to encourage and motivate Cayman's youth to continue God's mission of reaching out to the homes of the broken, the poor and the needy, to follow God into the world and always know that with God all are things are possible!
