Committee Meetings

The United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands is echoing the call for persons to develop a **healthy lifestyle**. In Jamaica, the Ministry of Health has embarked on a rigorous campaign to encourage persons to be more conscious of their lifestyle choices and habits. To exercise, eat right and to, in particular reduce the sugar content in beverages are among the recommendations being promoted as the preferred options for adults and children.

In the **Cayman Islands**, the following observation was made in the December 3, 2014 edition of The Journal 'When compared to nine other Caribbean countries, Cayman is on the higher end of the spectrum for overweight prevalence, and in the middle for obesity. **Obesity is weighing heavily on Cayman's population**, statistics show, and the figures are likely to keep ballooning unless government sectors come together to create a solution, according to several health industry leaders at the Cayman Islands National Healthcare Conference last month.'

The call is for all of us to give careful attention to our health and to ensure that we practice that which enables us to live unencumbered be severe health issues. **Attention is to be given not only to one's physical well-being but to also to one's psychological, emotional, mental and spiritual well-being.** For example, Candidates discerning a call to full time ministry will be required to undergo **psychometric tests** and **medical examinations** prior to being accepted for study.



SYNODICAL COMMITTEE MEETINGS HIGHLIGHTS

The **Synodical Committees and the Central Mission Council (CMC)** met in Jamaica during the week of October 22-27, 2018 in Jamaica.

Property Committee:

- National Housing Trust is interested in an additional 7.5 acres of the **Galina lands** to purchase for the installation of a sewage system.
 - Webster Memorial (Bodden Town) bell tower being restored
- Lease of duplex Mission House to Samaritan's Purse extended for an additional six months
- Mt. Olivet Boys' Home- new plans being drafted for proposed building to be constructed by Yohan Blake Foundation.
- **Mr. David Parkes** is the new Director at the Meadowrest Memorial Gardens following the retirement of **Mr. Leroy Lorde**.

Finance Committee

- International University of the Caribbean **Rev. Dr. Maitland Evans** has demitted office as President. Dr. Makeisha Evans is the Acting President and there is an on-going recruitment process.
- Statutory liabilities due 14/10/2018 to the Jamaica government have been paid.
- Audited Financial Statements (Jamaica Synod Account) as at December 2017 were presented but with a qualification regarding the valuation of lands and buildings.

Church and Ministry

- There are eight UCJCI students currently enrolled at the United Theological College (UTC). This number includes four independent students.
- The Ministerial Formation Programme is being undertaken in the following phases: Discernment, Core, Internship. In addition, each student will have a Mentor. (Documents are available at the Council Office outlining the programme)
- The Committee approved the Policy on Continuing Education for Ordained and Commissioned Ministers. (Copy available at the Council office)
- Lay Pastors will soon be receiving Identification Cards
- **Ms. Angela Martins** and **Rev. Dwight Kelly** represented the UCJCI at the CANAAC Regional Assembly in Guyana October 25-31, 2018.

Constitution and Doctrine

- Three Regions accepted the matters under the Referral Act. The fourth Region did not agree with one aspect and hence the Region has been asked to review its position.
- The Committee approved the proposed amendment to the Women's Fellowship Constitution regarding the separation of the Programme and Literature Committee.

Central Mission Council

- Proposed date for Synod April 28-May 1, 2019
- Lay Pastors' Training Curriculum will be standardized
- **Resolution** passed to review the role of the Moderator- should it become a full-time position?
- Resolution passed for CMC to appoint a team to review the Synodical Committees and CMC meetings in terms of the – process, frequency and methodology.
- General Secretary will send the information regarding the election of the new Moderator to the Regions in due course.
