CAYMAN PREP AND HIGH SCHOOL – LET YOUR LIGHT SO SHINE



With a student population of 971, CPHS is the largest private school in the Cayman Islands

Cayman Prep and High School remains committed to its Mission Statement to 'provide a stimulating learning environment, firmly rooted in Christian principles, in which our students become critical creative thinkers, responsible citizens and lifelong learners in an ever-changing world".

Under the leadership of the Board of Governors , Director **Ms. Debbie McLaughlin**, Principals **Karl Murphy** and **Trish Taylor**, the school continues to deliver world- class standard education to a student population of 971. This makes **CPHS the largest private school** in the Cayman Islands. Prep has a staff complement of 120 and a student- teacher ratio of 8:1.

The 2018 external examination results are summarized as follows:

Year 11: 57 Year 11 students gained 92 A* passes, 291 A* - A passes out of a total of 578 entries with 96% of students gaining 5 or more A* - C passes. 68% of Year 11 students earned 10 or more A* - C passes and 95% of our Year 11 students earned 7 or more A* - C passes. At IGCSE/GCSE 81.4% of all passes were A* - B and 95.7% were A* - C

Year 12: 66 Year 12 students celebrated outstanding success at AS level with a 93% pass rate with 76% of all passes in the A – C band with an outstanding 55% at A – B

Year 13: 41 Year 13 students celebrated outstanding success at A2 level with a 98.2% pass rate with 88% of all passes in the A – C band with an outstanding 64% at A^* – B.

Other Achievements

In July 2018 the school received notification that the 14 members of staff who had taken the Yearlong **COBIS** middle leadership course had passed and they have been awarded Certification as Middle Leaders. In August the Human Resources Officer, **Anna Pereira Johnson** and the High School Counsellor, **Denise Myers** successfully completed the Adult Mental Health First Aid (MHFA), two-day intensive training course.

The High School has embarked on **Every Child Matters**, a robust introduction to Personal Social and Health education for students. This delivery centers on staying safe, being healthy, enjoying and achieving, making a positive contribution and achieving economic well-being. In September the focus was on Healthy Lifestyles. October highlighted *"Achieving Economic Wellbeing"*.

Extra-curricular activities continue at both schools including Clubs, Sports Teams and School Trips. A total of 82 Clubs are being offered at the primary school this year and 57 clubs are offered at High this term.

Students at both sites are involved in caring for others. At the high school site students are required to offer a minimum of 10 hours of **community service** annually, and at the end of Year 11 students are required to have completed a minimum of 50 community hours for graduation.

LAY PASTORS' TRAINING INFORMATION

The Cayman Islands Regional Mission Council will be offering the UCJCI **Lay Pastors' Training Course** commencing in January 2019. Classes will be held once per month on a Saturday from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm.

Persons interested in being trained as Lay Pastors are being asked to do the following:

- **1. Prayerfully discern** if there is a calling on your life to serve the Church in this area of ministry.
- 2. Converse with your Minister as you discern God's will for your life.

3. Write to your Minister and Congregational Board to receive permission to undertake this course of training. (There is a Practicum component that has to be undertaken in the local Congregation and the Minister and Congregational Board needs to approve of the person's participation at this level of ministry.

4. Fill in and return the Application Form along with the letter of approval from the Minister of your Congregation.

5. Persons wishing to just do the training **without the Practicum Component** can also register.

6. Forms are available from the Ministers and are to be submitted to the Regional Deputy General Secretary at the Council Office- 292 Prospect Point Road, George Town Grand Cayman or via email <u>rdgs@cicucjci.com</u> by November 30, 2018.
