3rd Sunday of Advent: JOY

The season of Advent reminds us of the importance of spiritual preparedness, of the readying of our hearts and minds for the life transforming presence of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

On the 1st Sunday in Advent we lit the candle of Hope in our churches as a reminder that as followers of Jesus Christ we are the people of hope.

On the 2^{nd} Sunday in Advent we lit the candle of Peace as a reminder that we are the people of a special kind of peace, one that transcends all understanding.

The 3rd candle today reminds us that we are also the people of joy. Joy is fundamentally different from happiness. Happiness is a temporary feeling dependent on favorable circumstances and events that seldom last and can change quickly.

Joy, on the contrary, is a choice, a decision of our inner being, a recognition and appreciation of God's personal presence in our life, the treasuring of our relationship with God. In addition to this it is also the recognition of God's many favors to us, the celebration of God's goodness and love, forgiveness and mercy, God's gifts, promises and countless blessings.

In our fallen world almost everything is about chasing the promise of happiness in some way or another and many lives are ruined directly or indirectly in its relentless pursuit. Let us remember not to fall into the same trap.

Let us also remember those who find difficult to experience this joy because of their loss, suffering or circumstances. Ours is the sacred duty not only to have but also to share this joy - in sensitive and meaningful ways.

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!" (Philippians 4:4)

BRIEF COUNCIL REPORT

COUNCIL MEETING – held on December 9, 2019

Council approved the 2020 budget but with the following goals and realities:

GOALS:

- i. Radical Evangelism
- ii. Encourage Missional and Healthy Congregations in Council
- iii. Equipping the Lay Leaders
- iv. Ministering to Children and Youth
- v. Training Youth Peer Leader
- vi. Advocacy

REALITIES:

- I. The financial contribution from Congregations has remained the same for the past five years
- II. Congregations have indicated that they are unable to increase their contributions to Council
- III. The budget has a slight surplus due to the fact that there will be no Convocation in Jamaica or in the Cayman Islands in 2020
- IV. There is an increase in the cost of leadership training based on the UCJCI new Lay Leadership training mandate
- V. The work on the Prospect Youth Centre is 70% complete –electrical, air-conditioning, plumbing and fencing still need to be done
- VI. Forecasting the hosting of the UCJCI 2021 Synod - savings from 2020 are non-existent
