### **Service of Commissioning for Lay Pastor**

On the first Sunday of the new year approximately 120 United Church congregants gathered from across the island in the East End United Church for the Commissioning Service of Mr. Ormond Williams as the Lay Pastor for the East End and Gun Bay Charge.

Originally from St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Lay Pastor Williams received his Preaching Diploma from the Methodist Church in the Caribbean and the Americas where he served as a Local Preacher and was involved in several Christian youth organizations and activities.

Mr. Williams has been actively involved in the life and ministry of the Cayman Islands Regional Mission Council for nearly two decades in various areas and in the last seven years he served as Lay Pastor in the William Pouchie Memorial and John Gray Memorial Congregations.



The Rev. Rohan Forrester served as Liturgist and the Rev. Euthman Wray delivered a powerful and challenging sermon that was well received by all. The Deputy Regional General Secretary, Rev. Dr. Yvette Noble-Bloomfield read the Narrative and Ms. Angela Martins, Chair of Council led the Litany of Commissioning. Rev. Donovan Myers, Minister of the John Gray Memorial Church offered the Prayer of Dedication.



Following the service many stayed back and enjoyed a time of fellowship and the refreshments in the church hall. We together as a Council as well as individually offer our full support to and also wish God's continuing and abundant blessings on Pastor Williams, his wife Rachel and son Joshua as they embark on this new journey in God's service.

# Lay Leadership Development

On Saturday, January 18, 2020 a new, restructured lay training programme commences in all Regional Mission Councils of the United Church designed to provide training for specific groups of lay leaders as well as for those who seek to deepen their faith and would like to become better equipped for service.

The programme will be offered in three consecutive modules (three six-month periods) targeting the following groups:

Module 1. for Elders and interested persons

Module 1, 2. for specialized lay leaders

Module 1, 2, 3. for Lay Pastors

The modules are designed to progress sequentially, building on the previous one, and serving as a prerequisite for the next. The modules are <u>compulsory</u> for Elders, specialized leaders and Lay Pastors who have not received previous training.

Over the first six months period the following courses will be offered:

- 1. spiritual gifts and the discernment of God's call the spirituality of the leader the role of the lay leader in congregational life
- 2. transformational leadership
- 3. the leader as evangelist, disciple-maker and mentor
- 4. communication skills
- 5. strategic planning for church growth
- 6. components of effective caregiving
- 7. team building and conflict management
- 8. leading small groups
- 9. introduction to the Bible planning and leading Bible studies
- 10. planning and leading worship
- 11. church administration
- 12. history, ethos, doctrines and polity of the UCJCI understanding the sacraments

Application forms are available in each congregation (Minister or church office) for those required to participate or interested in the programme which is also free of costs for the participants.

# What is Epiphany about?
