Young Leaders Workshop



On Saturday January 11, 2020 a group of 25 strong across the Council participated in the Young Leaders Workshop at the Council Office organized by the YLNE (Youth Leaders National Executive).

The workshop was opened by Ms. Camile Watt Youth Minister for the Robert Young/Savannah Charge who also led the 'icebreaker' which was much enjoyed by all and set the tone for the rest of the morning.



The training focused on the importance of small groups in the life of the believer and the church. Youth Minister for John Gray Memorial Church, Mr. Ethridge Netz spoke about the biblical, theological and social backgrounds and aspects of community

and why being part of a community – especially a smaller unit – is such a crucial part of a wholesome, healthy and productive life. He also provided the participants with practical tips about how to set up and facilitate small groups, while Ms. Camile Watt spoke about 'icebreakers' as effective evangelistic tools and how best to incorporate them in small group meetings.

The workshop ended with words of thanks and encouragement by Rev. Euthman Wray, Minister of the Robert Young/Savannah Charge and Vice-chair of Children & Youth MAT.

PROSPECT YOUTH CENTRE AND COUNCIL OFFICE RENOVATIONS

In the October 5, 2019 meeting of the Cayman Islands Regional Mission Council the decision was made to attend to some long overdue renovation needs on the Prospect Youth Centre and the Council Office. Council members voted in favor of a C\$63,000 budget to address a number of issues including masonry, painting, electrical, plumbing, A/C and fencing related matters. Exterior and interior masonry works and painting commenced on the site on October 14 and were promptly completed on November 15, 2019 by Tyson Construction. The rest of the work will be attended to in early 2020.
