Shaken and/or Unshaken!?

On Tuesday, January 28 our normal, everyday life was suddenly interrupted by a 7.7 magnitude earthquake that shook the western Caribbean (including the Cayman Islands, Jamaica, Cuba, the Yucatan-peninsula of Mexico and was felt even in Miami).

While most of us have experienced an earthquake before, it never ceases to be a frightening and unsettling event, mostly because unlike other natural disasters they happen without warning. Further, it is a potent reminder of how tiny and vulnerable we are and how much we have grown to expect normalcy and stability in our daily existence.

Events such as this can cause serious damage to lives and physical structures but they can also bring forth what lies deep within each of us such as anxiety, fear, panic, calmness, trust, helpfulness, etc.

Just like solid, physical structures can crumble and fall, so can we 'collapse' (even if actually unhurt), or we can remain 'standing' (solid and strong) even if otherwise hurt or damaged.

With grateful hearts we give thanks to God who spared the lives of all who have been affected and that there were no significant damages to structures and infrastructures in general. We pray that we may learn from this experience to be more grateful for those around us and for the many things that make up our 'ordinary', everyday life. We pray that we may become people who can say with the psalmist:

- ¹God is our refuge and strength, always ready to help in times of trouble.
- ² So we will not fear when earthquakes come and the mountains crumble into the sea.
- ³ Let the oceans roar and foam. Let the mountains tremble as the waters surge! (Psalm 46:1-3 New Living Translation)
