# New Chair and Vice Chairs of Council

The Rev. Rohan Forrester was elected as the Chair of the Cayman Islands Regional Mission Council at a Special Council meeting held on Tuesday February 4, 2020. Rev. Forrester is the Minister of the Webster Memorial and the William Pouchie Memorial Congregations and the Chaplain of the Cayman Prep and High School – Primary site. Rev. Forrester was ordained to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament on November 14, 2002. He has been serving as a Minister in the Cayman Islands since September 2010.

Rev. Forrester replaces **Ms. Angela Martins** who served faithfully and well as Chair of Council from January 2015 – January 2020. Council wish to express our deep gratitude to Ms. Martins for the depth of her commitment and her leadership of the Council in these five pivotal years.

Council also elected three new Vice Chairs. **Dr. E. Elizabeth McLaughlin**, Elder and Congregational Secretary of the Elmslie Memorial Church was elected as the Vice Chair for Leadership. She will spearhead in this Council the Mission Action Team that is responsible for the UCJCI 'S Training of Lay Leaders.

The **Rev. Donovan Myers**, Minister of the John Gray Memorial Church was elected as the Vice Chair for Discipleship, a position formerly occupied by Rev. Forrester. This is another critical area of Church Growth and development and the Mission Action Team 's mandate includes the work and ministry of the Men, Women and Young Adults in our Region.

The **Rev. L. Christopher Mason** is the new Vice Chair for Evangelism and in this year when the UCJCI has declared that 'Evangelism is the heartbeat of the Church', this Mission Action Team, led by Rev. Mason will be introducing 'Operation Andrew' as one of the tools of evangelism.

Rev. Mason replaces the Rev. Alice Blair who served ably and well in the capacity of Vice Chair for Evangelism since January 2018.

The Chair will name in short order a new Member-at large to replace Dr. McLaughlin who has now become a Vice Chair. This Executive, as per the UCJCI Constitution, will continue the term started in 2018 and there will be a full slate election in the January 2021 meeting of Council.

## Women's Fellowship Annual Breakfast



The 2020 Women's Fellowship Week of the CIRMC-UCJCI culminated in the Annual Breakfast which was held on February 1, 2020, Saturday at the George Town Yacht Club and was attended by close to 60 persons. Guest speaker of the event, Rev. Euthman Wray in his address


#### **2020 - UCJCI** YEAR OF EVANGELISM
