Ash Wednesday Gathering



In the liturgical calendar of the Church **Ash Wednesday** marks the beginning of the season of **Lent**. The Lenten season is a time of preparation for **Holy Week** and **Easter** and is associated with fasting in order to aid the believer's focus on matters of spiritual importance. Fasting can take on many forms, lengths, intensity and practice.

In many churches Ash Wednesday is commonly observed with marking the forehead with ashes as a solemn reminder of our mortality and of our need to repent and reconcile with God.

The United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands at its 41st Synod, held in Montego Bay, Jamaica from April 29 – May 2, 2019, pledged to assist financially and in other ways to the work and ministry being done with and for boys in both Jamaica and the Cayman Islands.

The Moderator, the Rt. Rev. Dr. Gordon Cowans encouraged the whole church to be mindful of the vulnerability of too many of the boys in both societies. The four Regional Mission Councils, which includes our Council in the Cayman Islands were tasked with identifying programmes that were catering to the needs of boys and the offer tangible support.

The Women's Fellowship, an auxiliary in the United Church which in the Cayman Islands is chaired by Mrs. Carol Ann Ebanks, decided to respond to the Moderator's challenge and hence the **Boyz2Men Programme** was identified.

From the proceeds of the Thanksgiving Lunch held in November 2019, the sum of KYD\$500. O0 was earmarked for the Boys2Men Programme. We offer not only our financial support but pledge to support the leadership and the participants in whatever ways we can.
