Are We All Evangelist?

Please read Ephesians 4:4-16

The letter to the Ephesians written by the Apostle Paul looks at salvation from God's point of view. Paul was a pragmatist, he started churches, and of course, he was a missionary, spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ.

In this letter he gives us practical suggestions on how we are to walk, and it is based on the doctrine we find in the first two chapters on who we are in Christ.

Paul points out that we were made alive in Christ by accepting God's free gift of salvation. We became the followers, disciples of Jesus Christ and as such we are expected to grow in our relationship with God by reading God's Word, engaging in prayer daily, by fellowship and giving.

As disciples we are also called to point people to God – through our daily living, through our deeds as well as our words. For this purpose, we have been given certain gifts to use them for God's service and purposes. We all have been enabled to share the gospel of Christ through our own uniqueness and personality.


As disciples we are called to be persistent and consistent in building our relationship with God and thus grow and mature spiritually. Persistence and consistence are also necessary to build relationships with others who need to encounter and hear the gospel.

As a therapist I studied thousands of hours to obtain my license as a counselor to provide mental health care. In my professional capacity I am more of a disciple who nurtures than an evangelist. However, one can discern and evangelize. Although the client and counselor are not friends, there is a therapeutic alliance and relationship which facilitates the therapeutic session for optimum results and resolutions. The counselor provides the guidance and help, which includes offering emotional support to the client. Because of this power dynamic, the counselor is limited in her/his capacity to be an evangelist because the client is too vulnerable and the focus of the therapist is on fostering growth and resolution.

From the very beginning Christian faith spread by personal witnessing as well as evangelism. Evangelism is the public proclamation of the Gospel.

The function of the evangelist and the function of the disciple are necessary and each is vital. There are times when we are to evangelize and other times to nurture (disciple). But we can also be engaged in both.

Not everyone has the gift of evangelism like Billy Graham or other famous evangelists. Yet, in our own way we are called to share the Gospel and also to support those who have evangelism as a spiritual gift.
