MT. OLIVET CELEBRATES 50



he Mount Olivet Boys' Home, a ministry of the United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands (UCJCI) celebrates its 50th Anniversary at 9:00 a.m. on Sunday, November 12, in a Service to be held at the Mt. Olivet United Church under the theme "Nurturing Hope...
Transforming Lives." The
Moderator of Synod, Rt.
Rev. L. Christopher Mason will be the preacher.

The United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands in partnership with the Government of Ja-

maica, opened the doors of Mt. Olivet on February 6 1967 and had its official Dedication and Opening ceremony on April 20, 1967. At that time the Home had 48 boys ages 10 – 12 years mostly assigned by government through the Children Ser-
