The Rev. Harry Bodden was ordained to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament in the United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands on January 18, 1970.

Over the years has served with distinction in the Porus Charge, First Hill, and then the Falmouth Charge. He also served briefly at the Hampden, Barrett Town, and Mt. Zion Congregations in Jamaica.

In the Cayman Islands, Rev. Harry served in the Bodden Town /North Side Charge and the East End/Gun Bay Charge.

Rev. Bodden is an avid reader and is a deep thinker. A quiet soul, he serves God with faithfulness and has a passion for Christ and the Church. He articulates his faith and theology with enthusiasm and has been consistently committed to the importance and urgency of evangelism, especially of young people.

For many years Rev Harry offered ministry through the 'Worship the Lord', the United Church's radio program in Cayman and he also funded his own radio broadcast, 'Trust in Lord' aired every other Tuesday morning also on Radio Cayman.

Rev. Harry possesses the heart of a true pastor and has been constant in his inquiry of the well-being of his ministerial colleagues and regularly keeps in touch with his former members, adherents, and friends in the congregations in which he served.

May God continue to keep Rev. Harry in good health and bless him in all his endeavours.

The United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands and indeed the wider Jamaica and Cayman societies have been the beneficiaries of the wonderful ways in which God has enabled the Rev. Harry Bodden to exercise ministry throughout the fifty years of ordination.

Rev. Joseph Benjamín Crawford



The Rev. Joseph Benjamin Crawford was ordained to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament in the New Broughton Church on August 18, 1971.

He is a graduate of the United Theological College, Princeton Theological Seminary, and the University of Maryland.

Rev. Crawford served in the West Bay Charge which included then, the now John Gray Memorial and the Savannah United Churches from 1970 to 1976 prior to migrating to the United States of America.

Prior to his return to the United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands in 2001, he served for thirteen years as the Minister for the Lochearn Presbyterian Church(PCUSA) located in Maryland. Rev. Crawford during that time was also a Licensed Clinical Social Worker and served in the Baltimore City Public School system.

From 2001 January to December 31, 2006, Rev. Crawford served as the Minister of the George Town Charge of United Churches which includes the Elmslie Memorial and South Sound United Congregations.

He is known as a gentle spirit with a caring heart. His sermons were always eloquently delivered and they provided deep thought and stimulation for the hearers.

He is regarded as a true friend, a trusted confidant, and a wise counsellor. So it was not surprising that Rev. Crawford was

appointed as the first Counsellor of the Bethesda Counselling Center in 2007. His qualifications and experience in counselling as well as his pastoral background and caring disposition enabled him to demonstrate complete integrity in regard to maintaining the Christ-centeredness of the services offered at the Bethesda Counselling Center. He served there with distinction from 2007 to 2011.

Rev. Joe, as he is affectionately called by many persons in the Cayman Islands, is well-loved and respected. He has an infectious but quiet laugher and always cherishes the visit of friends and colleagues.






