The United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands (UCJCI) values the presence and participation of children in the life of the church and recognizes that ministry with children is vital to the advancement of the kingdom of God. UCJCI ministries are therefore targeted towards the nurture of children and involves meeting their needs in ways that are age specific.

UCJCI is committed to facilitating tangible means of helping children to have a personal knowledge of the Lord Jesus and to understand and implement the principles of Christian living in their lives. As part of the body of Christ our heart's desire for our children is for them to have a love and passion for the Jesus Christ and a love that overflows into a love for humankind.

General Secretary Rev. Norbert Stephens noted, "Scriptures offer us a clear and unambiguous image of Jesus as one who made children a central focus in his earthly ministry. Indeed, many of his teaching moments featured children in a central role. He encouraged their presence and blessed them, people were encouraged to have the faith of a child in order to gain access to the kingdom, a little boy's lunch was pivotal in the feeding in excess of 5,000 people. Children gravitated to Jesus simply because they were made to feel welcomed in His presence.

In exercising his ministry among children, Jesus offers a clear model for the church today? COVID-19 has served to disrupt the ministry with our children, especially here in Jamaica, where many are unable to meet physically. Our ministry to children must therefore be reimagined and new ways of nurturing them discovered, patterned and shared in order to ensure that they

We continue to commend the UCJCI's Children's Commission for the innovative ways in which they continue to ensure connection and nurture among our children in the new normal of this pandemic."

Human and Mission Resource Manager, Janet McConnell, noted, "What we seek to do is to nurture an awareness of mission as we teach the Christian faith." This accounts for an all-embracing ministry with children.

During the month of May, Child Month, UCJCI Update will feature various aspects of our ministry with children. These will include Children's Homes-Pringle Home for Girls and Mount Olivet Boys' Home; Educational Institutions—early childhood (Basic Schools), primary and preparatory, and high schools; Church Schools (Sunday Schools); and Girls' and Boys' Brigade. Update will also focus on the UCJCI's Childcare and Protection Policy and the Children and Youth Commission, both of which provide policy and practical guidelines for engaging with children.

# What guides our work with children?




#### The Youth and Children's Commissions

The Children's Ministry Commission and Synodical Youth Ministry Commission were established, to give focused attention to discerning the times, and determining the UCJCl's Children's and Youth Ministry direction, in response to the need to be contextually relevant and impactful

#### **REMIT OF THE COMMISSIONS**

The remit of the Commissions shall be to give focused attention to the goals of the Church's ministry to persons between 0 and 12 years (Children's ministry), and 13 to 25 (Youth ministry), and shall include:



The Children's and Youth Ministry Commissions would each bring together all urgent matters pertaining to the Children's and Youth Ministry, providing policy-making directives, vision and strategies, resources and evaluative tools, and will hold Regions, and by extension Congregations, accountable for these vital ministries in the UCJCI. Each Commission would provide a clearing-house/filter for the work/ministry to be carried out by the Children's Ministry and Youth Ministry auxiliaries. It would also provide space for common discussions, and would enable support and enrichment for its ministries.

#### THE GOALS OF CHILDREN'S/YOUTH MINISTRIES

The Children's/Youth Ministry Commissions shall ensure that the six (6) stated goals are met in all of the UCJCI's ministries to children/youth.

These goals are framed according to the following focus areas:

- Christian Nurture
- Denominational Identity
- Personal Development
- Growth
- Retention of Membership
- Children's/Youth Engagement

#### **COMPOSITION OF THE CHILDREN'S COMMISSION**

- Four (4) Programme Secretaries: one from each Regional Mission Council
- Four (4) regional representatives for Children's Ministry: one from each Regional Mission Council
- Three (3) representatives of the uniformed groups Boys' & Girls' Brigades of Jamaica & Girls' Brigade Representative from the Cayman Islands
- One (1) person with experience working with children
- Four (4) additional members, 2 of which shall be members of the clergy, 1 Lay Pastor, and the other to have expertise in either finance, communications, strategic planning or working with children.

The Commission is chaired by Mrs. Cheryl Shaw.


In a stirring worship service on Sunday April 25, 2021, Andrews Memorial United Church celebrated 58 years of ministry and service.

# PRAYER SPACES IN SCHOOL

This year marked the 7th annual Prayer Space event at Cayman Prep Primary School. During this time, the students, teachers, staff and parents were given the opportunity to openly engage in an "Underwater" themed Prayer Space set up in the school's Library.

This year, the theme was Shout for Joy, using the theme song, "Shout to the North and the South" (which all the children learned and could even sing the chorus in sign language!) and the memory verse: Psalm 89:12 "The north and the south, You have created them; shout for joy at Your name."

This is a special ministry and a much-anticipated time in the



school year. The students were excited for the opportunity to see what the space had to offer and to learn, think and be still while adults relished the peace and tranquility that the Prayer Space brings. The Library area was transformed into a haven of peace for 10 days, with areas for praying in different ways. Students could offer prayers of thankfulness and praise; pray for issues or people around the world; pray for themselves and their families; and had opportunities for time to be still and share their dreams with God; listen to music; ask for forgiveness; ask God BIG questions and recognize their own beauty in God's eyes. ## APPEAL FOR HELP FOR ST. VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES

My sisters and brothers,

The eruption of the La Soufriere volcano in St. Vincent and the Grenadines, on Friday April 9th, 2021 has been devastating. The severe physical, economic and social impact on the island of St. Vincent have been made more challenging as they have occurred in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic.

This disaster has caused much disruption in the lives of the people of St. Vincent and the Grenadines with the majority of the persons in the high-risk areas having to be evacuated and relocated. As of last week there are approximately 4000 persons in the emergency shelters. There has also been loss of homes, crops and livelihood but thankfully no reported loss of life.



The UCJCI is in conversation with the Methodist Church in the Caribbean, who are responsible for some of the emergency shelters on the mainland. We wish to partner with them through a financial contribution towards their initial efforts of providing relief through the purchasing of food, water, clothing etc., for those displaced by the disaster.

We are therefore requesting that your congregation/ charge makes a contribution to this effort through a special offering each Sunday from April 25, 2021 through to May 30, 2021. We are aware of the restrictions on attendance in worship in Jamaica and would suggest that, where possible, congregations make a contribution from their own funds.


