WE SAY THANKS TO THE CHIRWAS!

e say farewell with great gratitude to Rev. Elizabeth & Pastor William Chirwa, CWM Mission Partners from the United Church of Zambia, who completed a meaningful and productive partnership with the United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands on October 31, 2017 and departed Jamaica on November 14, 2017 to return to Zambia.

The Chirwas' encounter with the United Church started in 2003, when they participated in the Council for World Mission's (CWM) Clergy Exchange Programme. They served at Webster Memorial for three (3) months and that experience led them to candidate for service with the UCJCI for a full four-year term which began in 2005.

Their first posting was in the Lowe River Charge where they served for eight (8) years (June 2005 – July 2013) during which time the congregations grew spiritually and numerically and they endeared themselves to the congregations and communities, Their next posting was to the Davyton Charge

(October 2013 – October 2017) at a time when the Charge was broken. They worked tirelessly to bring healing and restoration and growth to this Charge. In addition, they facilitated the reroofing and refurbishing of the manse to the tune of over J\$4Million. They were able to get this done and fully paid for and they left the Charge in good financial health.

Their service was not confined to the Charges they had immediate responsibility for. Rev. Elizabeth served as leader of the Council's Intercessory Ministry and as a Vice – Chairperson on the Council Executive having responsibility

at various times for Congregational Transformation and Growth, Discipleship Stewardship and Evangelism & Church Planting. In the latter, Rev. Elizabeth made auite an impact in the area of evangelism as Charges were assisted with their evangelism training programmes. Rev. Elizabeth and Pastor William were also part of the Micro Finance team that monitored the programme and trained beneficiaries.

We celebrate the tremendous servant leadership that the Chirwas have provided to the Charges and communities they served and to the wider United Church!


GRATITUDE FROM WRMC YAAM FOR SERVICE.
