Ordination 2021 | No hugs, handshakes nor kisses

For the first time in 56 years the United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands ordained three ministers to Word and Sacraments in a way foreign to the practice of our denomination.

Our service of ordination, which has for many years occurred at the Ridgemount United Church in Manchester, took place on November 11, 2021, at the Webster Memorial Church in Kingston.

Reverend Anna-Kay Henry-McGregor, Reverend Sandra Collins, and Reverend Wendell McKoy, were ordained.

In last week's publication, Rev. Henley Bernard, Director of Ministerial Formation explained that ordination is not only for the gaining of status but it is the celebration of preparation undergone by the candidate, the recognition of the candidate's suitability for participation in the community's life, the embrace of the candidate through the 'laying on of hands' and the extension of appropriate signs of fellowship, as colleague and partner in the faith community's commitment to serve the cause of Christ.

However, this grand celebration in our current context, required the Moderator, the Rt. Reverend Gary Harriott, to "stretch forth his hand" over the candidates instead of the laying of hands on their shoulders by the

moderator and ministers. Because of COVID -19, we have aimed as a church, to avoid all physical contact except the bouncing of elbows to greet each other. Therefore, there were no hugs and handshakes or kisses.

In addition to this, the Webster Memorial Church which has the capacity to seat approximately 750 people, hosted only 50 people, including the clergy and the candidates, last Thursday. This was in keeping with the Covid-19 protocols and guidelines issued by the Prime Minister of

Jamaica. At the time, this stated that church services can only accommodate up to 50 people in accordance with the 6ft social distances rule. New measures were announced yesterday, November 16, 2021, and will take effect on Friday, November 18 (please see COVID-19 protocols on pg 5).

A maximum of 185 more people, witnessed the candidates' dedication to the service of Jesus Christ through the live stream of the event on our YouTube channel, UCJCI's channel.

As the authority to serve in the office of pastor was conferred upon them through the ritual of ordination by the faith community, expressions of praise rang in the pews and the live chat.

Viewers shared congratulations, well wishes, and prayers. There were some Reverends who rolled back the curtains to seminary and ordination in conversation with each other while awaiting the crossing over of their colleagues.

While Rev. Henry-McGregor delivered the response on behalf of the newly ordained ministers, the viewers joined in with laughter and expressions of agreement as she shared the journey.

The United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands, our church, proudly and prayerfully welcomes Reverends Anna-Kay Henry-McGregor, Sandra Collins and Wendell McKoy, along with the pledges taken by others, who not only considered the service of ordination an occasion but an opportunity to commit and recommit to personal acts.




I remember when there was always an item from the Church School at Harvest and Christmas Morning services. We were never left out as we are a part of the church and were never made to feel left out because we were children.

Cayman Islands

The number of COVID-19 cases in the Cayman Islands continues to rise. Of the 4,917 confirmed cases, 3,340 are active with 4 deaths and 21 persons in the hospital. The Cayman Government has responded with regulations aimed at controlling the spread of the virus, including but not limited, to protocols for travel and gatherings. Consequently, indoor gatherings, including church services, are now restricted to 100 persons. The restrictions are in place until November 22, 2021.

Jamaica

There are 90,341 confirmed cases of which 1,025 are active with 2,331 deaths. The Government of Jamaica, on November 16, 2021, announced amendments to orders under the Disaster Risk Management Act (DRMA). These provisions are for the period November 18 to December 9, 2021.

Please note and be guided by the following:

- 1. Church Services The number of persons allowed in the sanctuary for worship should be determined by the physical distancing requirement of a minimum of six feet between persons, but should not exceed 100 persons.
- 2. Weddings the maximum number of persons allowed is 100.
- 3. Funeral services are allowed with a maximum of 20 persons within the place of worship or facility.
- 4. Burials are allowed for 30 minutes Mondays to Fridays between 9 am and 4 pm with a maximum of 20 persons at the graveside.

The other relevant provisions remain the same as under:

- 5. No physical crusades, conferences or conventions will be permitted.
- 6. Physical Gatherings are limited to 10 persons.
- 7. Stay at home persons 60 years and over. Fully vaccinated persons are exempt.

Please note that the wearing of masks, hand sanitizing and social distancing are still required for public spaces and gatherings.

HAITI RELIEF

Since the earthquake, which had its epicenter near Haiti, on Saturday August 14, 2021, has devastated the nation, the country has been experiencing strong tremors. Many persons are still homeless and living under rubbles. Some are hesitant to erect concrete structures as they fear another earthquake at any given time.

At the last count, the death toll was 2,207, with 344 people still missing. The severe physical, economic and social impact on Haiti have been made more challenging as shortly thereafter they experienced the passage of Tropical Storm Grace. All of this follows the recent assassination of their President.







As part of our initial response as a church, we wish to offer financial support to the relief efforts in Haiti, through our established contacts there.

We are aware of the restrictions on attendance in worship in Jamaica and would suggest that, where possible, congregations make a contribution from their own funds.


