IUC honours two outstanding lay-leaders of the United Church



The International University of the Caribbean (IUC), will be presenting its first honorary degrees to two outstanding Jamaicans and Lay leaders of the United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands, who have served the church country well, making significant contributions in education and accounting. The presentations will be made at the university's annual graduation ceremony that will be held at 1 p.m. on November 25, 2021 at the Hope United Church, 221 Old Hope Road. The nominees are, Mrs. Irene L. Walter CD, and Mr. Donald Reynolds CD.

Mrs. Walter, a former Elder of the Hope United Church, was named the first female Registrar of the

Caribbean Examinations Council and is the outgoing Chancellor of IUC. Her contribution to education in the Caribbean, culminated with her most notable accomplishments, the launch of the Caribbean Secondary School Examinations Certificate, (CSEC) in 1979. Later in 1998, she presided over the launch of the Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examination (CAPE), as the replacement of the overseas-based Cambridge A-level Examinations. Many are the awards that Mrs. Walter received during her 40-year service to humanity and her former institutions. She was named to the Hall of Fame of her alma mater, Camperdown High School, to the "Corridor of Excellence" of Shortwood Teachers' College, recognised as a Distinguished Graduate by the University of the West Indies on its 50th anniversary, and honoured by the Government of Jamaica with the award of the Order of Distinction, Commander Class. She was duly recognised as a LIVING LEGEND by the Caribbean Community of Retired Persons.



CONSITUTION CORNER

This month's edition of Constitution Corner continues to look at Elders. In last month's edition we looked at 3. who Elders are, how they are elected and their term of office. This month, we look at the duties of an Elder, as 4. outlined in Paragraph 3 of the By-Laws.

The Congregational Board as the Executive Body

The Congregational Board is an important part of the governance structure of the Church. The Constitution 7. (Chapter 2, Section 2b) states that "the Congregational Board shall be responsible for the discipline and care of the Congregation" and "shall be the local executive body". The Congregational Board is constituted by the Elders along with the Minister. The duties of Elders in this capacity are set out more fully in section 3 of the 2. By-Laws. These may be conveniently grouped under the following headings.

Spiritual and Pastoral

- Support the Minister in the spiritual oversight of the church, providing pastoral care and support and ensuring the orderly administration of the worship life of the congregation;
- 2. Assist the presiding pastor by preparing and serving

elements in the Communion Service;

- watch carefully over the life and conduct of members, in conjunction with the Minister;
- Seek after persons for commitment to Christ and lead them to candidacy for church membership;
- Enquire after candidates and set a good example of Christian conduct and service to the church;
- 6. Assist members to live peaceably with one another;
- 7. Helping members discover their gifts and skills for ministry within and outside the congregation.

Administrative

- See that Church buildings and other property are kept in good order;
- . Assist with the financial management of the church
- 3. Exercise the disciplinary functions of the Congregation in accordance with the Constitution.

Something to Note

The Board shall be guided in carrying out its duties by *The Manual for Elders*, which is a publication of the United Church. It gives more details about how Elders should carry out their duties and best practices for Elders to follow.

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS FFECTING CONGREGATIONAL LIFE IN

Cayman Islands

The number of COVID-19 cases in the Cayman Islands continues to rise. Of the 4,917 confirmed cases, 3,340 are active with 4 deaths and 21 persons in the hospital. The Cayman Government has responded with regulations aimed at controlling the spread of the virus, including but not limited, to protocols for travel and gatherings. Consequently, indoor gatherings, including church services, are now restricted to 100 persons. The restrictions are in place until November 22, 2021.

Jamaica

There are 90,341 confirmed cases of which 1,025 are active with 2,331 deaths. The Government of Jamaica, on November 16, 2021, announced amendments to orders under the Disaster Risk Management Act (DRMA). These provisions are for the period November 18 to December 9, 2021.

Please note and be guided by the following:

- 1. Church Services The number of persons allowed in the sanctuary for worship should be determined by the physical distancing requirement of a minimum of six feet between persons, but should not exceed 100 persons.
- 2. Weddings the maximum number of persons allowed is 100.
- 3. Funeral services are allowed with a maximum of 20 persons within the place of worship or facility.
- 4. Burials are allowed for 30 minutes Mondays to Fridays between 9 am and 4 pm with a maximum of 20 persons at the graveside.

The other relevant provisions remain the same as under:

- 5. No physical crusades, conferences or conventions will be permitted.
- 6. Physical Gatherings are limited to 10 persons.
- 7. Stay at home persons 60 years and over. Fully vaccinated persons are exempt.

Please note that the wearing of masks, hand sanitizing and social distancing are still required for public spaces and gatherings.


Watch what weighs down your heart First Sunday of Advent


