The Biennial Conference of the Women's Fellowship was held from Friday, October 14 to Saturday October 15, 2022, under the theme: "Women Rooted in Christ – Bearing Fruits".

On Friday October 14, the conference was held virtually. Reports were presented and adopted from all the working Committees. 
The highlight of the day was the election of the new officers for the period 2022-2024. The following is the full list:

Following the election, the installation of the new officers was done by Rev. Khereen Wilson-Bailey, who also delivered a powerful charge to those present, using the theme for the conference.



On Saturday, September 24, 2022, the Southern Regional Mission Council held the Evangelism Leadership Symposium and Prayer Breakfast. Participants from all over the council gathered with the one goal in mind: It Must Be Evangelism! This was highlighted and emphasized by our Vice Chair for Evangelism and Church Planting Rev. Clifton Bailey as he shared an overview of the Evangelism plan for the Council. We had four presenters for the day who shared on different aspects of the subject matter: Rev. Norbert Stephens presented the Landscape for Evangelism; Ms. Gillian Martin presented the Methods of Evangelism; Rev. Donavon McPherson presented the Power of Evangelism and Rev Khereen Wilson Bailey presented Partnership in Evangelism. Feedback from the participants indicated that the presentations were well received and informative. Volunteer forms were also distributed in order to collect information of those who are willing to participate in the work of evangelism and receive information and training to strengthen their effectiveness in this area. Participants are expected to use the information and ideas they garnered to evangelize within their respective congregations and communities.



The event also saw the launch of the Take the City initiative. This effort would see teams doing intentional evangelistic work in selected communities. This includes prayer walks, street meetings, outreach missions and any other form evangelism needs to take to impact communities for Christ. On October 1, 2022, the Evangelism Mission Action Team, led by Rev. Clifton Bailey, did a walk through of the Blue Mountain community in Manchester as part of the Take the City initiative (See pictures). The team also conducted a pop-up street meeting on the following Sunday. Six (6) contact details for individuals were collected with the intention to nurture them into a life of faith in Jesus Christ.

The Symposium and Take The City are two strategies the Southern Regional Mission Council is using as they seek to continue "Working together, growing God's Kingdom, one congregation at a time".





TRAINING SESSIONS

INTRODUCTION:

Purpose of the Child of God, "Living the Word, Changing Lives..." Campaign/Ministry The intent of the Child of God, "Living the Word, Changing Lives..." Campaign/Ministry is to engender a lifestyle that physically brings to life the action/activities of the Spiritual teachings of Jesus Christ among the believer. That is to empower the believer to demonstrate the "Fruit of the Spirit" which are Love, Joy, Peace, Longsuffering, Gentleness, Goodness, Faith, Meekness and Temperance. (Galatians 5:22 & 23KJV) through The Development of "Active Spiritual Discipline".

Phase 2 – of the Child of God, "Living the Word, Changing Lives..." Campaign developed by the Discipleship Ministry of Webster Memorial United Church has been assigned to Public Educational/Training Sessions aimed at Members and Adherents of the Church.




