The Riverside United Church outreach project of the Riverside Basic School, got a new building, courtesy of the Food for the Poor who graciously accepted the challenge to renovate and refurbish the Basic School.

Much appreciation is also extended to the Toronto based partnership of the **Caribbean Chinese Association**, 'Helping Hands Jamaica Foundation' and the Canadian arm of **Food for the Poor**, who both provided the sponsorship, financial support, equipment, furniture, their time, resources and labour, to ensure the completion of the project. The Dedication Service was held October 26, 2017 at the Riverside United

Church, with children, the PTA, School Board Members, Staff and representatives from Food for the Poor representatives and the Caribbean Chinese Association in attendance.

The new Basic School building is a more suitable learning environment for our young ones. —an initiative with immeasurable impact; touching the lives of many not only for this generation but for generations to come.
