#EmbraceEquity

Wednesday, March 8, 2023, marked International Women's Day (IWD), a global celebration of the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women. This year's campaign theme is #EmbraceEquity.

But what is equity? Equity can be easily confused with equality. Sometimes they are even used interchangeably. But these two similar words cover two inherently different concepts.

Equality means having access to the same resources or opportunities.

Equity means having access to resources or opportunities necessary to reach an equal outcome.

The concept of equality is based on the principle of 'fairness'. Fairness, however, works only (and is truly fair) when the initial conditions or circumstances are the same.

Equity, on the other hand, takes into consideration the fact that people start from different places. Some may require more resources or opportunities than others to achieve the same goals.

Pre-Synod Consultation -CIRMC

March 11, 2023, is the date for the CIRMC Pre-Synod Consultation for the CIRMC. The meeting is via Zoom, commencing at 9:00 am. All registered Delegates and Observers are invited to attend. Rt Rev Gary Harriot, Moderator, Rev Norbert Stephens along with the Chairs of the Synod Standing Committees will join the Consultation. The working document for the Consultation is the Draft Synod Papers, which is an amalgam of the reports of the ministry and mission of the UCJCI over the past two years.

Mrs Rose Wedderburn, RDGS -NERMC will do an Orientation for Synod Delegates and Observers during the Consultation. The framework of the Synod and ways in which Delegates and Observers will engage in the Synod process form part of the Orientation.

The Consultation also serves as a pre-cursor for the use of the Zoom platform during the Synod. Delegates and Observers will

be in break-out rooms for the examination of the Reports. Decisions and general discussions will be held in plenary.

Service of Life and Witness

On Tuesday, April 25, 2023, the Service of Life and Witness will be held at the Elmslie Memorial Church at 6:00 pm.

This service memorializes those who have faithfully served the Church and have been called home during the 2021-2023 Synodical period. A floral tribute will be done in their honor.

The Synod will celebrate the witness and ministry of persons attaining significant Ordination milestones during the Service. Lay Persons from the four Regional Mission Councils will receive Special Synodical Awards for their dedication and faithfulness at the Congregational and Council levels. **Mr Lewin Handel Whittaker** and **Mrs Aliceann Kirchman** are the Awardees from the Cayman Islands Regional Mission Council.

Mr Heber Arch will receive a Special Synod Award for his service to the Church as a Member of the Cayman United Church Corporation.

All Ministers and Lay Pastors will receive Certificates of Appreciation for the resilience shown during the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Moderator, Rt Rev Gary Harriott will preach, and the Sacrament of Holy Communion will be celebrated during the Service.

All are invited to attend this service and share in the celebrations with the Awardees from the Cayman Islands Regional Mission Council.

Peace Initiative Project

At the 42nd Synod of the United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands, held in April 2021, the Peace Initiative was introduced. Each Regional Mission Council was asked to identify a project. The Cayman Islands Regional Mission



Council (CIRMC), at its October 8, 2022, Meeting identified the Cayman Island Crisis Centre as its Peace Initiative Project. The Mission MAT of the Council was tasked with coordinating this ministry.

As the result of the first effort leading up to Christmas, on December 16, 2022, the Chair of Council, Rev. Rohan Forrester presented a cheque of CI\$3,050 and Foster Gift Cards to Ms. Mariesha Spencer of the Cayman Islands Crisis Centre.

The Cayman Island Crisis Centre (CICC) can accommodate twenty-seven persons and there are on average four adults and six children per week. There is also a follow-up programme which currently has thirty-eight (38) adults and forty-two (42) children, which provides support and supplies for Clients.

The Mission MAT is now organizing an Easter drive as the Council continues its commitment to the CICC as its Peace Initiative and invites the Congregations and individual members to support this worthy cause.

The main items needed are:-

- Bed linen (preferably new single/twin and double sheet sets)
- Towels/ rags
- Grocery items and toiletries
- Kitchenware
- Grocery vouchers (Any supermarket and Cost U Less)
- Gift vouchers (Digicel, Flow, CUC)

The deadline for delivery of the items to the Council Office is March 31, 2023.
