### SYNOD IS OVER. NOW WHAT?

Jesus' commission to His disciples recorded in Matthew 28: 19, 20 continues to constitute the marching orders of the United Church. Guided by the vision - Touching Lives, Nurturing disciples and Seeking Transformation through Christ, UCJCI carries out its ministry and mission among people in communities on a local, regional and global scale.

The Synod, constituting representation from congregations in partnership with lay pastors, ordained and commissioned ministers have reviewed reports on work done in the synodical period. This highest court of the denomination listened to children and youth, recognised existing challenges and celebrations in national, regional and global contexts, and informed by those pieces of information, discussed and discerned the way forward through identified priorities.

Over the next few weeks, this series: Synod is Over. Now What? UCJCI Update will explore those priorities which ought to constitute our 'To Do' list as a denomination.

Today we begin with the first step, an important step -**Communication**. Our members must be adequately informed, and effectively motivated in order to be involved in the necessary action embodied in Christ's commission.

#### COMMUNICATION

The following are key first steps in Communication:

- Ensure the wider church has information on what took place and what decisions were made. The Popular Report has been produced to aid this task. UCJCI Update will continue to feature the work to be done and the work being done.
- Help the membership to understand the information. This responsibility is included in the role of delegates, lay pastors and ministers, regional and Synodical levels..
- Continued sharing of information on the points celebration of and concern in our church societies. and This responsibility is included in the role of the leadership at local. regional and Synodical levels.
- Keeping members of Council informed as regions plan, encourage and monitor action while developing strategies, sourcing training and collaborating on action in support of local congregations.

In a real sense the work of communicating rests with us all. Let us be willing to share what we know.
