UCJCI 43rd SYNOD THEME - Rooted, Resilient: Re-ignited by the Spirit (Return, Reconnect, Realign, Re-ignite)

Reconnect with the Triune God

"Relationships are difficult and challenging. It takes effort to maintain harmony in relationships, and our relationship with the Triune God is no different except that any shortcomings are on our part because God, our Heavenly Father, has already done His part. He is always there waiting on us. He sent His Son, Jesus Christ, as a sacrifice for our sins, and we remain connected with God through the Holy Spirit. That connection is vital to our spiritual wellbeing, and sometimes we need to reconnect. To coin the words of the Psalmist, as the deer pants for the water, so our souls should be longing after the Triune God." – (UCJCI Preaching Themes – Sunday, June 4, 2023)

The doctrine of the Trinity, affirming the three-in-one nature of God, was an integral part of Christian theology from the early centuries. Eventually, in 1334 became an established feast day in the Western Church. Its formal inclusion in the liturgical calendar served as a dedicated day to honor and reflect on the mystery of the Holy Trinity, providing the people of God a distinct occasion for worship and spiritual contemplation.

The Holy Trinity is an awe-inspiring mystery that defies human comprehension. No matter how assiduously the theologians of the Church tried to explain it and elaborate on its nature over the centuries, we are still left bereft of words. Maybe the best we can do is to humble ourselves before this profound nature of our faith and acknowledge the threefold revelation of God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

According to our faith, God is one yet three; the Father, who created us in His image, the Son, who redeemed us through His sacrifice and the Holy Spirit, who guides us on our spiritual journey. They represent distinct members of an eternal communion of love. Even though we cannot fathom the depth of this mystery, at least we can discern the interconnection and harmonious relationship between the three persons. For within God's heart there is perfect unity and a bond based on divine love. Just as the Father, Son and Holy Spirit exist in perfect unity in the bond of love, we are called to foster unity and harmony within our spiritual fellowships, Congregations, and communities.

Let us then approach Trinity Sunday with open hearts and minds. Let us be ready to Reconnect to our Triune God and one another. The truth is, we cannot separate the two. We cannot reconnect to God and, at the same time, remain in unkind, judgmental, and dysfunctional relationships with one another. Let us be inspired and transformed by the boundless love and

grace of our Triune God and strive for the same in our interactions with our sisters and brothers.

On this Trinity Sunday, may we rejoice in the depth and richness of our faith. Let us be grateful for the eternal love that sustains us and seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit in our pursuit of personal and collective holiness, unity, and love. May the mystery of the Holy Trinity continue to inspire and nourish our souls as we journey together as a community of believers and as members of the UCJCI.

- 7. Mrs. Debra Humphreys was added as a Signatory to the Scotia Bank account.
- 8. Mrs. Debra Humphreys and Ms. Theresa Bodden were added as Signatories to the RBC account.

The Motion for the acceptance of these resolutions was made by Mr Clive Hinds and seconded by Ms Melody McLean and passed unanimously.
