On Fathers' Day, Lucea United Church took seriously the charge to reach out to men by tailoring ministry to them. The congregation held their Annual 100 Men in Church Service. They achieved their objective as the church sanctuary was populated with more men than women.

### **Greetings from the Municipality**



## **50 YEARS OF**

## ORDAINING WOMEN

June 17 marked 50 years since the first female was ordained to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament in the then United Church of Jamaica and Grand Cayman, later The United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands as it is named today. The late Rev Dr Adlyn White was that first female.

Since the ordination of Rev Dr White, thirty women have been ordained to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament and are serving in church and community in Jamaica, Cayman and other parts of the world.

Rev. Dr. White also made history as the first woman to be elected Moderator of the Synod from 1991 to 1993. In 2013, the UCJCI called a second woman as Moderator of Synod, the Rev Dr Yvette Noble-Bloomfield, and is currently the Regional DeputyGeneral Secretary of the Cayman Islands Regional Mission Council.

### TWO WOMEN HAVE BEEN ELECTED TO THE POSITION OF MODERATOR





Rev. Dr. Adlyn White served as Moderator 1991–1993 and Rev. Dr. Yvette Noble Bloomfield 2013 –2015.

In affirming the ordination of women, the UCJCI has received for ministry, a number of women ordained in partner churches of UCJCI from the United Kingdom, the United States of America, Zambia, Ireland and Canada.

We celebrate the Rev Dr Marjorie Lewis who served as the first female President of the United Theological College of the West Indies, (UTCWI) (2010-2015) and the Rev Verna Cassells who served as a lecturer in Christian Education and Associate Warden at UTCWI for many years.

Our ordained women have served as Chair of Councils, Chair of Synodical Committees, and Director of the Kelly Lawson Centre, and the Madge Saunders Conference Centre. We salute the women who have earnestly responded to the Call to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament and thank God for the work, ministry and mission they have done in the UCJCI.

We remember specially those who are deceased - Madge Saunders, Adlyn White and Margaret Fowler.





# Worship at Home



As a natural response to the Synod's mandate, Rooted and Resilient: Reignited by the Spirit, the call to realign rouses us to renew our spiritual commitment. This realignment invites us to foster deeper intimacy with God, to be intentional with our personal evangelism, and practical in our nurturing of disciples. It impacts our worship, witness, and work. As people of God, we are rooted and resilient; we are (and have been) reignited by the Holy Spirit to REALIGN for the glory of God.

#### JULY - REALIGN THE HEART

It is when our hearts are realigned by the Holy Spirit that we can truly discern God's will and purpose for our lives.

#### Theme this Week:

The Realigned Heart is Obedient and Faithful

#### Suggested Scriptures: Genesis 22:1-14

The reading from Genesis offers the difficult story of Abraham's understanding of God as being in need of the sacrifice of the most loved thing in his life- his son Isaac. Yet in this text, we can see Abraham's heart. Previously, Abraham was disobedient and went ahead of God's plan, but in this text, we see Abraham returning to God with his heart realigned by God's Spirit. Such a heart, realigned by the Spirit, is obedient, faithful, and fearless. God does not need our plastic words or our self-seeking ways. God requires the truth from our hearts, in our words and in how we conduct our lives.

Paul continues this theme of obedience in the pericope to the saints in Rome. Do not let sin cause you to be disobedient; present yourselves as God's instruments of righteousness.




