

Our dear Sister, Rev Hyacinth May Edwards,

transitioned this life on Monday October 2, 2023 at the University

Hospital.

On October 11, 1981, she became the third female to be ordained in the United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands.

Rev Hyacinth served Christ and the Church faithfully and well for almost forty-two years. Her pastoral assignments included the Salem Charge in St. Mary, the Giddy Hall Charge in St. Elizabeth, the Eltham Charge, and since 1996, the Salem Charge in Clarendon.

She served quietly and lovingly, and these qualities endeared her to the members and adherents in her Charges and the wider UCJCI.

For twenty-five years, she served as the Chaplain and teacher of Religious Education at Clarendon College, where she was well-loved and respected by the staff and students.

She was a stalwart of the faith, a powerful Preacher, a dedicated Pastor, a friend, and counsellor. Rev Hyacinth was known for her humility, cheerfulness, and generosity of spirit.

We extend our sincere condolences to her family, particularly her siblings Rose Marie, Norma, Annetta, Reynold, Patronie, Maxine and Herrica.

We also surround the Salem Charge and the Southern Regional Mission Council with our prayers and condolences at this very tender time.

I'M SAVED: WHAT'S NEXT?

From September 22 to 24, 2023, twenty-one (21) youth from the Ebenezer, Andrews Memorial and Alligator Pond United Churches were engaged in a retreat focusing on their Christian walk. Held at the Hillcrest Diocesan Retreat Centre in St Ann, the youth participated in a purpose driven weekend of discussion, prayer, praise and team building under the theme "I'm saved: What's next?"

The young people determined the theme for the retreat as they felt they wanted to deepen their faith and understand how to live as Christian youth. With this in mind, they were engaged in sessions such as Understanding your Purpose, which looked at their future, Red Flag, which encouraged developing discernment and avoiding pitfalls of sin, Salvation, Around the Ring and Discipleship, which dealt with prayer, identity, accountability and service. Gospel artiste, Minister Kevin Heath, also shared his words of testimony and encouragement for the youth.

youth appreciated sessions and made strides in understanding aspects of their Christian walk. From the Around the Ring of Discipleship session, they were helped to identify some things to put in place to help them strengthen their faith. The youth fellowship at Andrews, for example, were inspired to host Bible study evenings in the fellowship at least twice per month as opposed to once. The group from the different congregations will also come together for fellowship at least once a month.

It was observed, that the time with the youth was short and so the leaders have committed to continuous conversations, which should include a follow-up in October and another in December.

"I am saved: what's next?" is perhaps a question that many young people have asked on their Christian walk.

UCJCI WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP IN NERMC COMMEMORATES 30 YEARS OF WITNESS

A letter dated September 24, 1992 invited the women of the Women's Guild Executive to attend a meeting with the Executive of the Disciples of Christ Women's Fellowship.

This meeting brought together the leadership of both organizations. Led by Presidents Vernice Fuller (United Church) and Hermena Davidson (Disciples of Christ) the women engaged in very fruitful discussions which paved the way for future dialogue and sharing of programmes.

December 13, 1992 was a day of celebration as the two denominations merged into one. This brought about the merging of the WOMEN'S GUILD and the WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP.

Much thought was given to naming the entity. For women this is a significant event. After much thought and prayer the overall membership agreed that GUILD should be replaced with FELLOWSHIP.

And so it happened that the newly merged Women's Organization was named "The Women's Fellowship of the UCJCI with President General, Vernice Fuller. Since then we have had eleven Presidents General. She was followed by Sisters Hermena Davidson, Francine Jackson, Mercilia Mallet, Ruth Coke, Lorna Jackson, Norma Sinclair, O. Rose Henry, Evelyn Jones, Pauline Bryan and our current President General, Cheryl Shaw.

TRAINING LAY LEADERS - A NEW BEGINNING

UCJCI LAY LEADERS CERTIFICATE COURSE - MODULES 2 AND 3 COMING

The Training of Lay Leaders for specialised ministries in the United Church will be advanced through the addition of Modules 2 and 3 to the offerings of UCJCI Lay Training Institute in November 2023.

Modules 2 and 3 will begin in November 2023. It is planned that both will run concurrently with the early topics in Module 3 being those without a corresponding pre-requisite in Module 2.

Topics will include Ministry with Children, Evangelism and Discipleship; Ministry with Youth and Communication. Both modules will include periods of practicum.

Module 2 will end in March 2023 and Module 3 will end November 2024.

Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Breast cancer is the leading cause of cancer and cancer-related deaths in Jamaican women. In Jamaica, women often present with advanced stages of breast cancer, despite the availability of screening mammography for early detection. The utilization of screening mammography for early breast cancer diagnosis seems to be limited, and this study investigated the national patterns of mammographic screening and the impact of mammography on the diagnosis of breast cancer in Jamaica.
