## UCJCI MODERATOR VISITS EAST END/GUNBAY CHARGE IN CAYMAN

On September 8, 2023, at the invitation of the former East End-Gun Bay Charge of the CIRMC, the Moderator of the UCJCI, the Right Rev. Gary Harriott, arrived in Grand Cayman for a weeklong unofficial visit.

Unofficial it may have been, yet it was no ordinary visit, for it was an opportunity for the Moderator to reconnect with old friends and reunite with the congregants of his former Charge. The Moderator served as Minister of the East End-Gun Bay Charge between 1993 and 1997. (Note: Since 2021, the East End and Gun Bay Congregations, along with the William Pouchie Memorial United Church in North Side, constitute the current North-East Charge of the CIRMC).

In addition to visiting his former congregants in their homes, the Moderator also served as guest preacher and as the Celebrant of the Sacrament of the Holy Communion on Sunday, September 10, 2023, at the William Pouchie Memorial United Church and the East End United Church.

The Moderator's sermon focused on "Hydrating the Soul" from Isaiah 55 and charged the congregations to look at where they are now and where they need to be. He said that a dehydrated soul manifests itself in several ways, such as staying away from the church, a lack of participation in the ministry, lacking spiritual growth, anger with themselves and others, and ignoring the leading of the spirit. #### **Edna M. Moyle Primary School**

On Monday, September 11, 2023, the Moderator participated in the Annual Convocation of the Edna M. Moyle Primary School, North Side, held at the William Pouchie Memorial United Church.

Chaplain of the school, Rev. Rohan Forrester, gave the main address to students, staff, parents, and other members of the community, including the Hon. J. Ebanks, the Member of Parliament. The theme of the Convocation was "New Beginnings". Rev. Forrester, based on Genesis ch. 1:1 said that "New Beginnings" often feel great, as they give a sense of hope and joy and are filled with excitement and relief.

We must seize the opportunity whenever we leave the past behind and enter a new season with hope, promise, and a new vision. Before there can be a new year with new beginnings, the old, with its challenges, must be left behind. However, what's new soon becomes old, and we sometimes feel no reason offering praise or even taking notice of what God is doing. God started a new thing at the beginning of creation, and to date, God is still doing a new thing' in the lives of our children and school staff. Rev. Forrester also encouraged the children to look at what they did last year and what they need to improve in this new school year.

#### 'Stand Firm and See'

The sermon was delivered by Rev. Carlene Walford, minister with responsibility for the Goshen United Church charge in NERMC. Sprinkling her charge with words of advice from a 'senior student' to the 'student', Rev. Walford's delivered a fiery challenge framed with the words 'Stand' and 'See'. Rev. Walford drew on the lessons of Exodus 14 where the children of Israel, in the face of challenge, stood their ground and as a result witnessed (saw) the miracles of God in delivering them. Standing in the face of difficulty also requires the armour of God which the preacher referenced in Ephesians 5. The St. Paul's congregation and the new minister were encouraged to be rooted and grounded in the faith, anchored in Jesus Christ and trusting in the help of the Spirit. #### UCJCI LAY LEADERS CERTIFICATE COURSE -MODULES 2 AND 3 COMING

The Training of Lay Leaders continues in the conclusion of another cohort of Module 1 on August 30 with anticipated Graduation on Sunday November 12, 2023. Assessments are now being done towards the completion of the list of graduands.

Modules 2 and 3 will begin in November 2023. It is planned that both will run concurrently with the early topics in Module 3 being those without a corresponding pre-requisite in Module 2.

Topics will include Ministry with Children, Evangelism and Discipleship; Ministry with Youth and Communication. Both modules will be including periods of practicum. Module 2 will end in March 2023 and Module 3 will end November 2024.




