TRAINING OF LAY LEADERS – MODULE 1 CONCLUDES...MODULES 2 AND 3 LOADING

Registration Opens in October

On March 11, 2023 UCJCI, through its Lay Training Institute, began a third round of Module 1 in the UCJCI Lay Leaders Certificate Course. On August 30 the 2023 training concluded. As assignments are being marked and graduation planned, the long-awaited Modules 2 and 3 loom on the horizon.

Module 1 provides the foundation for preparation for service as a leader in UCJCI with introductory topics that offer vital skills and knowledge for leadership. Those who have been selected to serve as elders are required to do Module 1, however the training may also be pursued by persons who want to serve in other ways.

Module 2 builds on the foundation skills and knowledge of Module 1. It will prepare persons for service in specific ministries.

What will Module 2 Include?


Areas to be covered in Module 2 will include

- Ministry with Children
- Evangelism and Discipleship
- Pioneer Ministry with specialised groups (e.g. men, persons with disabilities)
- Ministry with Youth
- Communication

The module will involve practical exposure.

Who may register for Module 2?

Persons who have completed Module 1, may register for Module 2. Such a person interested in serving as a leader in the specialised areas identified, may build on the training in Module 1 by deepening their skills and knowledge in these special areas in Module 2.



What will Module 3 include?

Module 3 prepares persons who want to serve as Lay Pastors. Consequently, the module will include detailed preparation of participants to carry out the duties of a Lay Pastor. This will include preaching, administering the sacraments and exegesis.

Who may register for Module 3?

Persons who have completed Module 1, and have registered for Module 2 may also begin Module 3. It is important to note that persons who intend to offer themselves for service as a Lay Pastor in UCJCI will need to complete all three modules of the UCJCI Certificate Course.

When will Module 3 begin?

Modules 2 and 3 will be run at the same time.

Foundation Values Under Attack - Prayer Breakfast at St. Andrew Preparatory School

St. Andrew Preparatory School, hosted a Prayer Breakfast on Tuesday August 29, 2023 under the theme "Together We Rise" to start off the academic year. The guest speaker for the occasion was Rev. Dr. Wesley Boynes, President of the Jamaica Independent Schools' Association (JISA).

In his address to the gathering Rev. Dr. Boynes noted that there were "dark forces" at work against the foundational values on which church-affiliated private educational institutions were built.

He encouraged staff, parents and members of the church to be guardians of foundational values, noting that the vision behind faith-based educational institutions "was about producing God-fearing students

He challenged the churches to be more intentional about ensuring that the operations of their schools were in keeping with the values of their Church, observing that some schools were not as focused as they should be in this regard.

In keeping with the theme of the prayer breakfast, 'Together We Rise', Rev Boynes lifted up the following for consideration by all stakeholders:

- Rise up together and pray for the school and also pray for other private schools and the wider education system as the devil's priority is the children
- Rise up together and revisit the original mission of the school
- Rise up together and protect the foundational values, culture, and spiritual values of the school.


For Your Health
