As part of the ongoing Peace Initiative of the Cayman Islands Regional Mission Council, the Council's Mission MAT has continued donating to the Crisis Center, this time Back to School supplies.



The supplies were backpacks, lunch kits, water bottles, pencil cases and gift vouchers for the students supported by the Crisis Center.

These gifts were made possible by donations from members of the nine (9) United Church Congregations in Grand Cayman, coordinated by the MAT member in each congregation.

At the 42nd Synod of the United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands, held in April 2021, the **Peace Initiative** was introduced. Each Regional Mission Council was asked to identify a project. The Cayman Islands Regional Mission Council (CIRMC), at its October 8, 2022, Meeting chose the Cayman Island Crisis Centre as its Peace Initiative project.


