



UCJCI 43rd SYNOD THEME – Rooted, Resilient: Re-ignited by the Spirit (Return, Reconnect, Realign, Re-ignite)

Fan the fire in each other with integrity, accountability and encouragement

Integrity is doing the right thing even when no one is looking, and accountability is about taking responsibility for our actions (or lack of action). Fanning the fire will require that we do the right thing by God’s standards and that we take responsibility for our stewardship. This includes the way we mentor others, allowing them just enough responsibility to grow (but not too much, so they don’t falter under the weight) and encouraging them along the way.

Judges 4:1–7 (Deborah and Barak)

Deborah, a prophetess and judge, sends God’s message to Barak to take on the role of military commander and lead the army to battle. When Barak hesitates, due to a lack of self-confidence, Deborah encourages him to fulfil his mission and assures him that God will give victory.

Psalms 123 (Seeking God’s mercy)

The psalmist looks to God with humility, hope, and expectancy, seeking mercy and relief, displaying trust in God despite the challenges and difficulties.

Matthew 25:14–30 (The Parable of the Talents)

God entrusted all of us with ‘talents’ (gifts, abilities, resources, etc.) not for our edification but for God’s purposes and glory.

1 Thessalonians 5:1–11 (The Day of the Lord is approaching)

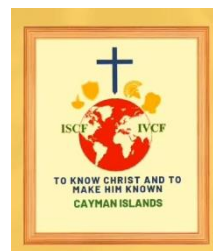
Paul encourages the Thessalonians to live in the light and be children of the day, emphasizing a life consistent with Christian principles. He instructs them to build each other up and live in hope, fostering a positive and supportive community.

God calls us to consistently nurture integrity, accountability, and encouragement in our relationships.
