

### THE DANIEL FAST

During the Season of Lent, many Christians engage in various forms of fasting, prayer, and reflection as part of their observance. One popular fasting practice is the Daniel Fast, inspired by the biblical account of Daniel in the Old Testament (Daniel, chapter 1). The Daniel Fast typically lasts for a specific period, often 21 days, though the duration may vary.

Participants in the Daniel Fast abstain from certain types of food, including meat, dairy, sugar, and processed foods. Instead, they focus on a diet rich in fruits, vegetables, wholegrains, nuts, seeds, and water. This practice and other forms of fasting serve as a spiritual discipline. Those undertaking the Daniel Fast aim to cultivate a closer relationship with God through prayer and self-discipline.

In addition to its spiritual significance, the Daniel Fast also serves as a moderate form of dietary cleansing, contributing to overall health and well-being. This dual purpose makes the Daniel Fast a meaningful and wholesome approach for those seeking both spiritual and physical benefits during the Lenten season.

# ECUMENICAL NEWS WCC and the Roman Catholic Church in Joint Effort



A Joint Working Group has been established to support a growing partnership that benefits all programmatic areas of the World Council of Churches (WCC) of which the UCJCI is a part.

According to the WCC website: :The Roman Catholic Church is the largest, by far, among those churches that are not members of

the WCC. Cooperation between the Roman Catholic Church and the WCC continues to grow across all aspects of the WCC's work for a common Christian witness and service,.The Joint Working Group, co-sponsored by the WCC and the Roman Catholic Church, is an effective tool to strengthen this cooperation.

Rev. Dr Yvette Noble Bloomfield, one of UCJCI's representatives to WCC is a member of the Joint Working Group.

The primary objectives of the meeting were to facilitate a deeper understanding among participants through personal introductions, as well as sharing insights into their respective work and ministries. Continuing participants reflected on the recent history of the Joint Working Group.

The meeting also included updates on recent activities of the parent bodies, ensuring participants were informed about ongoing initiatives and priorities. Core discussions centered on the future work of the group, which also approved the Terms of Reference 2024–2030, which will guide the work of the current mandate.

### **DEEPENED FAITH**

JESUS: HIGH & LIFTED UP; PROPHET & FULFILMENT OF PROPHECY

4th Sunday in Lent

It is hard to see/understand a God Who sends serpents to punish the Children of Israel for their disobedience, as a God of Love. But serpents appearing out of nowhere could be God's punishment, as well as it could be the consequence of their vituperative actions (their words were poisonous as viper's fangs) and so, Moses' serpent was necessary for the people's healing.

Jesus' reference to the bronze serpent in the wilderness was not so much about venerating the serpent as it was about helping Nicodemus, a theologian and scholar, to understand that Jesus is The Ultimate Saviour and in Him is healing from sin for all eternity. The lifting of the serpent on a pole has two significant messages for us today.

1. The serpent on the pole was higher than everything else, and thus visible to all. For healing grace to be effected upon the Children of Israel therefore, they needed only to look up. And by looking up, they could get up. and have access to God's grace that heals our unrighteousness, and replaces the need/tendency to worship idols.

2.Jesus may have been alluding to the cross – it is only in His death, resurrection, and ascension that Jesus is proven Lord and Saviour of ALL. His crucifixion, outside the city, on a pole on a hill was intended to be a public warning for the Jews of the day, yet Jesus turned all that upside down because He literally was placed in the 'highest' point to offer salvation to any who looked at Him and believed.

Many are still locked in unbelief and fail to see the glorified Jesus. Yet, whenever we fall prey to the sting of the serpent's temptation, we need only remember God's abiding love in Jesus Christ and look up (to Him) so we will be able to get up.




