ITHE CALL TO CONVOCATION WAS MET WITH A RESOUNDING RESPONSE IN THE GATHERING OF 8,000 PLUS WORSHIPPERS AT THE MONTEGO BAY CONVENTION CENTRE. THE ATMOSPHERE WAS CHARGED AND THE SEA OF RED STRETCHED ACROSS THE MAIN AUDITORIUM INTO THE GATHERING SPACES OF YOUTH AND CHILDREN. AS THE BUSES ROLLED IN, ONE HAD A SENSE OF HIGH EXPECTATION OF THE TIME OF GATHERING. AS SONGS OF PRAISE WERE RAISED, EXTEMPORANEOUS PENTECOSTAL PRAYERS VOICED AND THE WORD POWERFULLY PROCLAIMED, THE SPACES WERE ENERGIZED. WOULD THAT AS WE DEPARTED FROM THE PLACE OF GATHERING, THAT WE MOVE INTO THE SPACES WE OCCUPY DETERMINED TO WITNESS TO THE POWER OF THE HOLY SPIRIT WHO ENABLES US TO BEAR WITNESS TO JESUS CHRIST.

THEY WORSHIPPED

The praise began at 8:31 a.m. and rousing choruses including 'We come here to praise', 'Sing Praises unto God' and 'My Soul doth Magnify the Lord' resonated through the auditorium as the sea of worshippers clad in red raised their voices in song and danced to the glory of God.







I'To the tunes of 'We are Together Again' and 'Get Together in the Lord', the assembly of worshippers celebrated the gathering which had not taken place for six years. The atmosphere was joyful and emotional.



GOD'S WORD WAS

DECLARED

REIGNITE TO REPLENISH

"The church receives her life and power from her Lord. Hence she must constantly be renewed in him. This is why an occasional change, revival, or reform will not suffice. The church must be constantly renewed and reformed by the Word and the Spirit of Jesus Christ, her head".

These are among powerful words of challenge delivered by the preacher, Rev. Glenroy Clarke, Minister of Lucea United Church in Hanover.

Preaching from the text: Ezekiel 47: 1–12 which concludes with a wonderful picture of the temple giving life to the world, Rev. Clarke declared, "In Ezekiel 47:1–12, the Lord gives His prophet a vision of water flowing out from the temple in Jerusalem. This imagery gives us a vivid, prophetic portrayal of the Spirit's work in the church. We see what types of things should be happening when the Spirit is at work among the people of the Lord". This includes the filling of empty places, fruitfulness, healing of broken, hurting people; and there is transformation and life–giving power.

He called for **divine energy** emanating from God on the altar. The altar is a place of fire and fervour and the fire on is to be kept burning. Our passion for God - worship and honour - needs to be reignited with a renewed divine energy as a community and as individuals.

He called for a **deliberate discipleship journey** inspired by the Holy Spirit so that our church is missional. "Mission begins at the place of sacrifice, is launched in worship and transforms creation".

He said further, "The Holy Spirit sends us to call people back to God through Jesus. The Holy Spirit sends us to be people who heal relationships. The Holy Spirit sends us to be people of peace, not violence. The Holy Spirit sends us to bring good news to the poor and the wounded. The Holy Spirit sends us to restore broken creation, not because we are afraid of what will happen to this planet, but because we are full of hope about God's good intentions for his creation".



...we, like the prophet, must go deeper into the river (flowing from the temple in Isaiah's vision) if we individually and as the church want to experience fulness of life, healing, and fruitfulness.


