Children, as we look at the theme 'Children Re-ignited by the Spirit....Wi Reddi fi di Road', it suggests that there is something within us which has gone cold but has found new life and therefore causes a desire for us to want to do something new or different.

ANDREWS MEMORIAL IN SRMC CELEBRATES 60 YEARS AND GIVES BACK TO THE COMMUNITY

Giving Thanks, Giving Back

The Andrews Memorial United Church in celebration of 60 years of ministry made good on her decision to give back to the community in a tangible way. The theme that provided the platform for the Anniversary celebrations was Giving Thanks, Giving Back.

On May 7, 2024 the church handed over two hospital beds valued at over \$300,000 to the Mandeville Regional Hospital.

The decision came about as we noted that the sick who turned up at the hospital extended would spend an time (sometimes days) in wheelchairs or on benches as they are being attended to by the medical personnel. The general cry of 'no beds' has been heard by many members of Andrews as they go to visit relatives and friends who remain in the Accident and Emergency Unit beyond a reasonable time span in uncomfortable and overcrowded conditions.

We hope that our response will assist the most vulnerable among us and inspire others to respond to the issues in our health care system or any other challenge that affects us in community.

WEBSTER MEMORIAL IN NERMC CELEBRATES 83 YEARS PROVIDING FUNDS FOR A SECOND CHANCE FOR FEMALE INMATES

The Webster Memorial United Church donated \$100,000 towards the completion of Bachelor of Science degrees by two inmates of the South Camp Adult Correctional Centre for females (SCACC) at our 83rd anniversary service on Sunday May 19, 2024.

Webster's Correctional Service Ministry, a sub-Ministry of the Community Care Ministry (CCM), ministers to the ladies of SCACC every 1st Sunday of each month, in a number of ways including sharing the Word of God, Bible quizzes, counseling, providing personal care items, arranging legal and medical assistance where possible.

When the Church was approached by the SCACC on behalf of inmates, it was without hesitation that our Church immediately agreed that we must support this cause. Through an adjustment to the CCM budget and sponsorship, \$100,000.00 was identified to assist the ladies.

The two ladies who are pursuing the degree were present along with other inmates who also contributed to the Service in song!

The Webster Memorial United Church believes in the expansion of God's Kingdom, by going out into the wider communities beyond the walls where persons would not want to go

RE-IGNITED BY THE SPIRIT – FOR WHAT?

School Pastors' Programme - An Opportunity for Action

Since last year the North-Eastern Regional Mission Council (NERMC) has been trying to encourage persons to sign up for the School Pastors Programme to be equipped for a ministry that would support our schools. The take up from NERMC has been minimal with confirmation of only two (2) persons completing the training and being commissioned to date.

There is great need for this ministry as we see what has been happening among our school children and young people in recent months. In the last few weeks we have heard or increasing number of seen an of violence incidents among students. A student from our own Meadowbrook High School was seen in a viral video viciously beating a schoolmate last month. At other schools, 2 students were killed in weeks, of which recent one happened on Monday of this week, May 13.

We gathered at Convocation 2024 on May 5 and were challenged to be "Re-ignited by the Spirit" for action.



STREET AND SCHOOL PASTORS' TRAINING COMING

The Moderator, Rt. Rev. Gary Harriott charged us to "Go back to our families, churches, schools re-ignited and communities as people, empowered to be difference makers". This is a practical way in which some of us can respond and equip ourselves to make a difference in the lives of our young people. It's time for action, the Moderator said, "The people of the United Church must get up and go, get up and do, get up and be". "What are the re-ignited people of the United Church prepared to do?" The Holy Spirit is prompting us. Let us respond in obedience and be a part of the transformation we want to see in our communities and country.

The next Street Pastor's Training will be from June 1–July 6, 2024 in this Region. Training is free. The first session is Face to Face on June 1 at HEART Beauty School, 15 Hope Road, Half Way Tree. All other sessions will be on Zoom, mostly in the evenings. You can apply online using this link:

WORSHIP THEMES FOR HOME AND OUR CONGREGATIONAL GATHERINGS

LET US WORSHIP

Re-Ignited by God's Spirit into a life of Holiness:

Isaiah, the anointed prophet of God had an encounter with God's Spirit that resulted in his personal transformation.

Remind congregants and ourselves that despite being 'near' church, it is easy to be far from God (consider linking to I Samuel 3:1-2).

Note that an encounter with God's Spirit invites reflection and true repentance. Upon repentance (confession), it is possible to reignite the flame, which confirms our status as children of God.

Make the connection between the cloven tongues at Pentecost (see readings last week) and the live coal that cleansed and renewed the prophet.

Life in the Spirit is a call to holiness and righteousness that invites us to bear witness to others.

Invite the congregation to an encounter with God's Spirit that leads to personal repentance and the deliberate discipling of others.
