CHILD MONTH FEATURE

'Wi Ready Fi Di Road!'

My fellow children, can I ask you this question - What do you understand by this topic: Reignited by the spirit "Wi ready fi di road"?

Let me explain the meaning of two words:

1. Reignited: means: To catch fire or cause to catch fire again.

2. SPIRIT - The word spirit has a lot of meanings but I am using this meaning - A special attitude or frame of mind.

Now that we understand the meaning of these two words, we can now move on.

Let us catch fire for God with some attitude today in this place.

Every fire, when left alone, will eventually diminish and fade to ashes. For a fire to remain alive and blazing, it demands new fuel to be added to it, as well as someone attending to it, for example stirring it, and fanning it into flame. So it is with our life in Christ, especially as children serving Christ. While you may have been fervently devoted to the Lord in the past, unless you have been tending to the flame and nurturing your spiritual walk, it will diminish into ashes. Now, let us consider the consequences of neglecting our spiritual growth as children.

Now we are turning our attention to reigniting our spiritual fervor, 2 Timothy 1:6 reminds us to "fan into flame the gift of God." Let us focus on some ways to reignite our spirits:

- **Reignite your passion** for God. One way we can do that is to start having friends who are passionate about God.
- **Reignite your faith** in God; as James 2:22 states, "faith without works is dead."
- **Reignite your hope** in God by making prayer a priority every day. Especially in these times when we are faced with so many problems .
- Reignite your knowledge of God, by reading your bible, and asking questions about God's words. And I am asking you this question: when last have you read your bible? A word a day keeps the devil away, and my final point
- Reignite your consistency in serving God, by setting aside time to spend with God every day. It is very important to know God's words so you cannot be tricked by anyone.

THE CONVOCATION CELEBRATION CONTINUED IN THE AFTERNOON

In this final feature on our Convocation 2024, we focus on the Afternoon Celebration and the Launch of the Salt Spring Initiative.

The afternoon session of the Convocation was marked by celebration and praise as well as awareness-raising of the rationale behind the proposed mission initiative in Salt Spring, St. James aimed at rescuing young men and children.

Guided by the theme, 'Re-ignition Through the Arts', the presentations helped to advance the planned approach to mission with Salt Spring.

THE CELEBRATION CONTINUED IN THE AFTERNOON ...

'Re-ignition Through the Arts'

The afternoon's programme featured a number of performing arts items by Hope United Church drummers, Salt Spring United Church Choral Group, a choral presentation by Lowe River United Church and The Gideons Acappella group of men from Lucea United Church. Preceding the afternoon's expressions was a parade by the Heights Marching Band, an initiative which has successfully engaged young men in the Farm Heights community. The climax of the afternoon's demonstration of the use of the arts for healing, expressions and ministry was a combining presentation video dramatic drama spearheaded by Rev. Kevin, 'Nana Moses' Calvert depicting the pain of a family at the death of a young man - a victim and perpetrator of violence.



Conversations and Testimonies

Conversation and Testimonies from the West provided stories of young people from the community troubled by violence who bucked expectations and are poised for success. A profound declaration concluded the testimony of a young man.

Moderator's Challenge

What are you going back to do reignited people of the UCJCI?

Moderator of the Synod, Rt. Rev. Gary Harriott closed the Convocation with a charge to the membership. He asked, "How will our Ministries benefit from the fact that we gathered here today? How will our communities benefit from the fact that thousands of United Church members gathered here today to seek the face of God; to listen to; to feed upon the Word of God and to be re-ignited by God's Spirit? How will we return; what will be different, or will we just blaze up like bushfire and then go out cold until the next Convocation?

I call us and I charge us to be a Church with a purpose.



People must feel the presence of our congregation in their communities, if not, you are wasting time. People's lives must be touched by our congregations, if not you have no purpose".

THE CELEBRATION CONTINUED

"We believe in the lived Gospel, that's why we are engaging in the peace initiative in Salt Spring. When we met to plan this Convocation, we said there is no way the United Church could gather in Montego Bay with some of the challenges in St James without a practical demonstration of our presence here".

"...too many of our children are not going to church; too many of our young people are not in church because we have been keeping the light to ourselves too much. You are salt and you are light; add flavour sisters and brothers; shine; show some youngster; some child; some family the way and then the Gospel will come alive and people will know the transforming power of God to turn lives around and to point them to a better place".

"We have work to do; many lives need to be rescued. Too many of our young people are going astray..."

LET US WORSHIP

Re-Ignited to Deepened Faith by Knowing God's Spirit:

2nd Sunday after Pentecost

The texts remind us that it is not enough to know the Law/Scripture, it is more vital to be under the influence of God's Spirit. To be under the influence of God's Spirit comes from interaction with and openness to God. Although Eli interacted with God as part of his duties, he was not as intentionally engaged.

Consequently, God's judgement was upon him for his failure to chastise his sons for desecrating God's name and God's temple. Yet eventually Eli recognized that God was the one calling Samuel. Thereafter, Samuel stuck with God and God's purpose and the Gift of God's Spirit passed on to him. [Note that although the term 'the light in the temple had gone dim' was referring literally to the lamp, it could also be read as a metaphor for the times.

Could the light have been reignited by Samuel's love and obedience?]

Do a contextual reading of your country. Is the light of God still visible in the land? There may be cause to consider who God speaks with in your context, and who God is trying to reach. Is there cause for revisiting how youth are nurtured in the faith? How do you as a congregation listen for God's voice.
